Community Action For Improvement, Inc. (CAFI) is a private non-profit service organization offering comprehensive assessment and assistance to low-income individuals, including seniors, children, and working families.

CAFI is part of a national hub linking 1,000+ Action Agencies. By being a part of this powerful network, we leverage programs and dollars to serve more people. 99% of all the counties in America are served by an Action Agency. Our reach is far and wide.

As a registered 501c3 organization, we focus on those living in poverty. Serving the West Georgia region, we have neighborhood service centers in Carroll, Coweta, Meriwether, and Troup Counties.

Over the past 50 years, we've helped, and advocated for, over a million people in need. Most of our funding comes from State and Federal grants, supplemented by financial and in-kind contributions from individuals, companies and organizations.

We assist people with critical needs and we build connections within the community. Our long-term goal is to help people become stable and economically self-sufficient, empowered with resources and self-esteem they need to create a better quality of life for themselves, their families, and ultimately, our communities.

No matter the circumstance, we feel that every human deserves respect. CAFI staff and volunteers consider the people we serve our 'clients.' We serve them with compassion and respect.

2017-2018 Programs Offered:

Low Income Home Energy Assistance (LI HEAP) Program

• Financial assistance to eligible households to help offset their utility (heating) burden

Housing Stability and Homeless Prevention Program


- Helping people find safe and stable housing or aiding to prevent disruption of housing (eviction)
- Case management to assess family needs and develop an Individualized Service Plan
- Barrier removal to eliminate reasons for homelessness

Home Weatherization Assistance Program

- Conservation measures that result in energy and cost savings for single-family homes, multifamily buildings, and mobile homes
- Energy-efficiency measures performed through the program may include air and duct sealing, wall, floor, and attic insulation and heating, ventilation, and air conditioning system improvements

General Barrier Removal (not program specific)

- · Household supports such as diapers, personal hygiene items, and gently used clothing
- Emergency Food Pantry
- Linkage and referrals to other local agencies and resources
- GED and Education Supports

Helping People Cover Their Utility Bills

The ongoing costs of electricity, gas and propane, especially during the winter, can be a burden on any household. But for some, the money simply isn't there. That's where the **Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)** comes to the rescue.

Through LIHEAP, financial assistance is provided to help make utility bills manageable for eligible families. The largest segment of CAFI's resources go toward administering LIHEAP, and it is the program we are most often recognized for.

Helping to Create Healthier Homes

Tiny gaps throughout a house, especially around windows and doors, reduce the effectiveness and efficiency of heating and air conditioning systems. Families often use their heat, pay for fuel, and *still* feel cold.

CAFI's Home Weatherization Program engages professionals to seal those gaps and make other efficiency upgrades that reduce energy bills for low-income households. In addition to these energy conservation services, we make important health and safety upgrades.



Helping Families Remove Barriers

Getting ahead can be a challenge, especially when individuals aren't sure *how* to navigate. Families need support systems. They often need aid and resources.

Barrier Assistance provided by CAFI helps people retrieve vital documents they need; come up with first-month security deposit or past-due rent; and find training, wardrobe and transportation required to secure and maintain a steady job.

Helping to Find Safe and Stable Housing

Most of us can't imagine what it's like to not have a home. Being homeless is a devastating problem that naturally contributes to an array of other difficulties in a person's life.

CAFI is there to help prevent homelessness. **Housing Assistance** case managers assess each situation, and can help provide emergency temporary housing, assistance with missed rent payments, and security deposits for permanent housing.

Helping People Stay Healthy

Those who are least able to afford prescription drugs, sadly, are also often least likely to have adequate (or any) medical insurance.

CAFI Prescription Assistance not only helps pay for medication, but also helps cover other health supplies.

She gave me the gift of hope, which was something I haven't had in such a very long time. Of all the people I had written to, which was a very long list, only CAFI responded."




