We serve individuals and families in **Carroll, Coweta, Heard, Meriwether and Troup Counties.** Our **home weatherization program serves additional counties of Douglas, Harris, and Muscogee.**
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CAFI assists people with critical needs such as finding safe and affordable housing. We offer financial assistance, while embedding budgeting and other financial concepts into the case management. Our long-term goal is to make families economically mobile and build a better quality of life.

CAFI Programs:

Low Income Home Energy Assistance (Li-HEAP) Program


• Financial assistance to eligible households to help offset their utility (heating and cooling) burden; heating funds offered once a year beginning in November and cooling funds, when available, are offered in the Spring.

Housing Stability and Homeless Prevention Program

- Helping people find safe and stable housing or aiding to prevent disruption of housing (eviction)
- Case management to assess family needs and develop an Individualized Service Plan
- Barrier removal to eliminate reasons for homelessness
- Offering temporary shelter when necessary
- Providing opportunities to learn skills to help build economic mobility (job skills, financial literacy, personal development and more)

Home Weatherization Assistance Program

- Delivering conservation measures that result in energy and cost savings for single-family homes, multifamily buildings, and mobile homes
- Energy-efficiency measures performed through the program may include air and duct sealing, wall, floor, and attic insulation and heating, ventilation, and HVAC system improvements
- When funds are available, we offer minor home repairs to prepare the home for weatherization

The Year In Review: This is How CAFI Impacted Lives

Reducing Energy/Utility Burdens for Families

For homeowners across the country, the electricity bill has risen every year since 2002. According to the U.S. Energy Information Administration (EIA), the cost of electricity will continue to rise. This can be difficult for low income households, or those living on a fixed income. Senior citizens are particularly vulnerable.

The **Low-Income Home Energy Assistance (Li-HEAP) Program** rescues thousands of families each year. We provide a financial stipend to reduce the energy burden in the Winter, and when State funds are available, we offer similar stipends in the Spring to offset cooling costs. The largest segment of CAFI's resources go to administer this program.

Helping to Create Healthier Homes

The **Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP)** increases the energy efficiency of dwellings owned or occupied by low-income persons. WAP uses *Whole House Weatherization*, which treats the house as a single energy-consuming system, rather than a loose collection of unrelated pieces of equipment. It requires advanced diagnostic skills and cost-effective measure selection and installation.

These conservation measures result in energy and cost savings. Singlefamily homes, multifamily buildings, and mobile homes are eligible. The benefits of WAP are many including providing a safe, improved home environment, increased financial independence and enhanced quality of life. Weatherization creates an average energy savings of \$350 or more per year and reduces a home's annual gas heating consumption by 32 percent. WAP stresses the importance of a client's health and safety by installing smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors.

Creating Permanent Solutions for Safe, Affordable Housing and Barrier Removal

CAFI works continuously to house low income families, help them avoid the eviction process, and/or find safe environments for the homeless. Addressing housing in rural areas is always more difficult due to limited resources. Families need support and they need resources.

We take a two-generational approach to housing, so we are addressing the "whole family" which is often extended relatives and grandchildren. This approach boosts the power of our education and employment systems, which ultimately empower people to "plug into" their community and new opportunities.




Financials
