CAFI, INC. DEFERAL POLICY FOR WEATHERIZATION SERVICES

It is the policy of the Community Action for Improvement, Inc. (CAFI) Weatherization Program to provide Weatherization Services when those services may be delivered effectively and safely, without undue hazards to our staff or our clients. <u>Listed below are conditions that will not allow us to perform work on dwellings</u>. If these conditions are found when your dwelling is reviewed your house will be deferred from receiving Weatherization Services until conditions are corrected:

- * Standing water, mold, friable asbestos, deteriorated lead-based paint surfaces or other hazardous materials, this cannot be addressed by the weatherization work.
- * Evidence of infestation of rodents, insects, and/or other vermin
- * Unable to provide proof of ownership of the property.
- * Unsecured pets that may prevent workers from safely completing their work
- * The presence of sewage or animal feces in the home
- * Improperly stored chemicals, combustible materials, or other fire hazards that present a danger to the occupants or the workers
- * Maintenance or housekeeping practices that limit the access of workers to the dwelling or create an unhealthy work environment
- * Major remodeling in progress, which limits the proper completion of major weatherization measures
- * The home receives HUD funding and at the time of completion, the unit will not meet applicable HUD Lead Bases Paint Standards
- * Electrical, plumbing, or structural failures that cannot be addressed as a part of weatherization services
- * Threat(s) of violence or abusive behavior to worker(s) or household member(s) during the weatherization process

The illegal presence or use of any controlled substance in the home during the weatherization process.

WHAT IS THE WEATHERIZATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM?

Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) has been in existence since the 1970's. Reduce energy costs and address health and safety concerns through weatherization.

The Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) increases the energy efficiency of dwellings owned or occupied by low-income persons. WAP uses Whole House Weatherization, which treats the house as a single energy-consuming system, rather than a loose collection of unrelated pieces of equipment, it requires advanced diagnostic skills and cost-effective measure selection and installation. These conservation measures result in energy and cost savings. Single-family homes, multifamily buildings, and mobile homes are eligible.

Energy-efficiency measures performed through the program may include:

- ✓ Air and duct sealing
- ✓ Wall, floor, and attic insulation
- ✓ Heating, ventilation, and air conditioning system improvements
- ✓ Energy efficiency improvements in lighting
- ✓ Hot water tank and pipe insulation
- ✓ Water conservation devices
- ✓ Caulking of windows and /or doors
- ✓ Weather-strip
- ✓ Thresholds
- ✓ Energy conservation kit
- ✓ Windowpanes
- ✓ Testing of all gas burning appliances for carbon monoxide
- ✓ Check heating and cooling units for service or repair
- ✓ Water heater wrap






